CHANUKAH BEGINS TUESDAY EVE DEC. 2

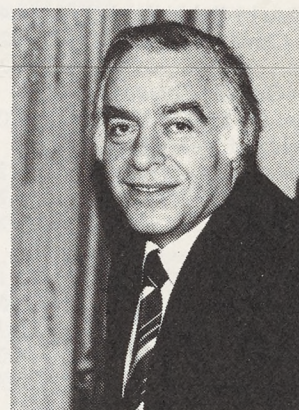
Chanukah commemorates one of the major turning points in Jewish history. In the year 168 B.C.E., the Syrian Emperor Antiochus Epiphanus launched a campaign of religious persecution against the Jews. His soldiers desecrated the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. For three years Judah the Maccabee led a valiant army of loyal followers against the mighty Syrian legions. After routing the enemy hordes, they rededicated the Holy Temple and reestablished the traditional worship. This consecration was celebrated for eight days. To this day we kindle Chanukah lamps to celebrate not only the events of the hoary past but also as a symbol of the Almighty's mighty deeds throughout the ages.

The first candle is placed at the extreme right of the Menorah. Each night following an additional candle is placed to the left of the previous one. However, the order of lighting the candles is from left to right—so that the added candle is kindled first.

The Sages prescribe that the Chanukah lights are to be placed on the left side of the street entrance to one's home—facing the Mezuzah on the right door post. (This custom is observed by many in Israel.) In the diaspora the Chanukah lights are placed on a window sill facing the street. If one's resi-

dence is more than thirty feet above street level it is preferable to place the lights near the left side of the entrance within the home, since above thirty feet the objective of *Pirsum Haness* (publicizing the miracle) is not fulfilled. The preferred placement for the Chanukah candles is between one foot and one meter from the floor.

The Chanukah lights should last a half hour into the evening. On Friday (the candle should be large enough to last over an hour—Sabbath candles are therefore recommended) we light the Chanukah candles before the Sabbath candles; on Saturday night the Chanukah candles are kindled at home after Havdalah is made.

Benedictions Over The Candles

Baruch atah ado...elokainu melech ha'olam asher kide'shanu bemitzvosav vtzivanu lehadik ner shel Chanukah.

Baruch atah ado...elokainu melech ha'olam she'assah nisim la'avosainu bayamim hahame ba'ze'man ha'zeh.

Blessing recited only at the first kindling:

Baruch atah ado...elokainu melech ha'olam she'he'che'yanu ve'ki'ye'manu vehi'gi'anu la'ze'man ha'zeh.

TO HOST A SABBATH KIDDUSH OR A SEUDAH SHLISHIS PLEASE CALL OUR OFFICE

KIDDUSH AND HAVDALAH

The obligation to sanctify the Sabbath with *kiddush* on Friday evening as well as the *havdalah* on Saturday night applies to men and women. The head of the household recites the *kiddush* and *havdalah* on behalf of all present.

Kiddush may be recited over wine or *challah* on Friday night; for Saturday lunch only over wine or another beverage.

The one who recites the *kiddush* pours some of the wine into another cup for distribution among those present, before he drinks at least two ounces from the *kiddush* cup. At *havdalah* the wine is not distributed.

Before the time for *kiddush* or *havdalah* we do not partake of any food. After it is dark on Saturday night "work" may be done if one recited the "*Atta chonantanu*" paragraph in *Ma'ariv* before *havdalah*. If this prayer was not said it suffices to recite "*Hamavdil bain kodesh l'chol*". *Havdalah*,

These months the Kree'as Shma should be recited before coming to services on Saturday mornings.

however, should be recited as soon as possible.

At *havdalah*, the cup is over-filled with wine as a good omen for the week to come. If wine or grape juice are unavailable, other popular beverages may be used. The *havdalah* candle is extinguished afterwards in the overflow in the plate.

The *besamim* (spices) which we inhale should signify to us that we will preserve the spirit of the Sabbath, the source of strength and consecration, for the working days of the week to come. They were also meant to give us an added "spiritual lift" after the holiness of the Sabbath atmosphere departs from us.

If *besamim* are not available for whatever reason they may be omitted at the *havdalah*. The blessing over the *besamim* may be recited later in the evening.

The blessing over "fire" should be recited over a candle (with at least two wicks) that has been lit after the Sabbath has terminated. A clear glass bulb may also be used. This blessing may also be recited later in the evening if "fire" is not available at the time of the *havdalah*.

The fire which man is permitted once more to produce by his own efforts, a symbol of man's creative endeavors, is the first element to be utilized after the Sabbath to brighten the darkness of the night. By reciting the blessing over the fire, we acknowledge it as an instrument granted by G-d for man's dominion over the earth and we declare we will utilize the power granted us in accordance with His will. (Rabbi Elie Munk)

Inasmuch as a blessing must refer to some immediate purpose, we fold the fingers over the palm of our right hand, turn them back to the light and gaze at them to distinguish the nails from flesh and to perceive the distinction between light and shadow in the palm.

The cup is held in the right hand except during the blessings over the *besamim* and the fire when the cup is held in the left hand. The left-handed reverse the order.
