### CHAMISHAH ASAR B'SHEVAT TUESDAY JANUARY 20

Chamishah Asar B'Shevat (the fifteenth day of the Hebrew month Shevat), in Temple times determined the dating of the produce relating to tithes. The Mishnah refers to this day as Rosh Hashanah L'Ilanos (New Year for Trees). It is also called Tu (the *teth* and *vav* Hebrew letters total fifteen) B'Shevat.

Chamishah Asar B'Shevat is observed by the eating of fruit products for which the Holy Land is noted, such as dates, figs, grapes, and carob ("bokser"). We partake of fruit which we have not as yet eaten during the year for the blessing of "Shehechiyanu." Tachanun prayers are omitted.

### A BOOK REVIEW

**The Study and Practice of Judaism — A Selected, Annotated List**, by **Micha Falk Oppenheim**. Xvi preliminary pages; 78 pp. Brooklyn: Torah Resources. \$4.95. Reviewed by **Rabbi Aaron Reichel, Esq.**

It takes courage to publish a Bibliography of Jewish books without including even a single title by the likes of Elie Wiesel, Martin Buber, or Isaac Bashevis Singer. It takes an unusual degree of selectivity to gloss over Nobel Laureate S. Y. Agnon's **Bridal Canopy** and other of his similarly well known masterpieces and single out, instead, only his **Days of Awe**, "a treasury of traditions, legends and learned commentaries concerning Rosh ha-Shanah, Yom Kippur and the days between." What makes Micha Falk Oppenheim's Bibliography of Jewish books so special is its adherence both to authentic Judaism and to its carefully articulated title — **The Study And Practice of Judaism**.

The Bibliography focuses on English-language books on Jewish subjects — but not just any Jewish subjects. Officially, the book covers 13 categories. The 13 chapters range in scope from books on the written law to books on the oral law, from books on ethics to mysticism, from books on the laws within Judaism to books on the relationships between the laws of science and the laws of Moses. The books in most of these categories have two common denominators: They aid in the analysis of authentic Jewish law and lore, and in forging Jewish culture into the consciousness of its readers. The Bibliography may be the only one in existence — certainly the most complete one — to focus on English language books on Jewish practice and study.

Although a high percentage of the books in Oppenheim's Bibliography are classics, most of the "old" books seem to bear modern names of new translators, editors,

compilers and revisers. The overwhelming majority of the books were published within the past decade or two, reflecting the rapid inroads English books have made in Judaism. The language of the "New World" has now overtaken German and Yiddish as the most presently published language — other than Hebrew — in Judaism.

The Bibliography is not without its drawbacks. For one, the Bibliography's book dealer listing is far from complete. Also, the Bibliography only lists books still in print as of its own date of publication. This policy necessarily excludes, unfortunately, many excellent works of the past including our late Rabbi Emeritus Herbert S. Goldstein's *Bible Comments* and *Between the Lines of the Bible*, which outlines reasons for all the laws.

These exclusions provide positive side-effects. They make room for more readily available titles. They also prevent readers from going on disappointing fruitless searches into bookstores instead of spending their precious time searching for other worthy alternatives that are more readily available. Finally, the exclusions may encourage those with the funds to reproduce them or the creativity to emulate them to do so. We were glad to note that our own Rabbi Reichel's book on Rabbi Isaac Halevy is featured.

Most notably, the book's publisher claims it is the first Judaism Bibliography — let alone annotated Bibliography — devoted exclusively to traditional Torah literature in the English language. The book is also virtually unique in its inclusion of pamphlets in addition to full-length books. Besides all the written Torah resources, the Bibliography lists organizations that publish their own catalogues and it carries an exciting feature consisting of the burgeoning sources of cassette Torah tapes on subjects ranging

from "love and marriage" to the **Book of Lamentations**, and disseminated by organizations and individuals.

Keep in mind, that even the most erudite have much to learn from many of these books even though they are all in English.
