Excerpts from "Long Island Jewish World" feature, September 18-24, 1981: **NEWSWEEK BARES VICIOUS ANTI-BEGIN BIAS.**

It is difficult to say which of America's two major newsweeklies is becoming more one-sidedly critical of Israel. Two weeks ago, *Time* ran a several thousand word essay pressing Israel to withdraw to the pre-Six Day War borders, as well as to make additional concessions. The essay, written by chief diplomatic correspondent Strobe Talbot, did not call upon the Palestinians or other Arabs to make reciprocal moves on behalf of Israel's security. And *Time's* cover juxtaposed a small, corner photo of a glum-looking Menachem Begin with a very attractive portrait of actress Meryl Streep, the subject of its cover article that week. Under the Begin photo were the words that set the theme for Talbot's piece: "America and Israel: The Need to Get Tough."

In its issue of last week (September 14) *Newsweek*, however, managed to "trump" *Time's* harsh approach to Israel. Its cover showed a blue *Magen David* (Jewish star) within which were six machine guns forming another *Magen David*. They in turn framed a painting of Begin which made *Time's* photo look flattering in comparison. It depicted the Israeli Prime Minister with half a dozen warts on his face, set jaw, thick glasses and a hard, rigid look. The caption, which doubled as the title of the cover article, asked rhetorically "Roadblock to Peace?"...

The cover article itself quotes an unnamed "nettled Administration official" as saying, "Everyone in town, all the way from the janitor to the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of State, hates Begin with a passion." (We can be thankful that the janitor does not join the two Cabinet members in helping to formulate American policy.) And it observes of Begin that "He believes he is entrusted with the fate of what he calls 'the remnant' of the Jews. And, to protect them, he practices a never-again philosophy of taking any action necessary against any perceived enemy." Even severe Begin critics refrain from this kind of hyperbole, provided they are the least bit fair-minded. But *Newsweek's* animus against Israel's leader is so strong that it even "spills over" into a description of the head of the Labor opposition, who is referred to as "the somewhat less stiff-necked Shimon Peres."

Written Caricature

The article also manages to make, among other tendentious points, the claim that Begin "knows almost nothing about the personalities of Arab leaders." The one source cited for this "insight" is an unnamed "U.S. diplomat who knows [Begin]" and who claims that "The only anecdotes that catch his ears are how the Saudis chop off the hands of thieves, or anything else that reinforces his prejudices." This sort of written caricature belongs in the *National Enquirer*, not in the cover article of a newsweekly read by millions of people throughout the world...

The *Newsweek* piece also claims that Begin's "goal...of meaningless autonomy" for the Palestinians in Judea and Samaria "could give Israel a free hand to dominate the West Bank the way South Africa dominates Namibia." The analogy is offensive and inaccurate: it was Begin, after all, who at Camp David went against his entire life's political beliefs by leaving the question of the West Bank's ultimate sovereignty open to negotiations, with the Palestinians being part of the negotiating process. And the Israel-South Africa comparison, so frequently wielded by anti-Zionists, collapses when one considers that

neither Begin nor any other important Israeli leader has ever advocated anything vaguely resembling apartheid.

Perhaps most troubling about the *Newsweek* piece is its discussion of American-Israeli relations. It makes the vague, simplistic and patronizing assertion that American policymakers to date "have justified support for Israel largely as a gesture of moral witness." And it insinuates that, of all things, Begin's policies have helped the Soviet Union (never mind that recent Israeli actions have made life difficult for the USSR's friends in the Mideast, including Syria, Iraq and the PLO). The source of this one-dimensional "analysis"? — still another unnamed official, this time British, who states that "Begin's actions make it hard for any Arab state to be too closely tied to the United States — allowing the Russians to pressure pro-Western countries like Saudi Arabia." The British official does not elaborate what "pressure" Moscow has been putting on Riyadh, which seems quite occupied trying to win congressional approval for \$8.5 billion worth of AWACS and other advanced American weapons.

...And no matter how one feels about Begin's policies themselves, *Newsweek's* September 14 cover article presents a prime example of slanted writing, or editorializing-in-the-guise-of-reporting.

We pray for rain until Passover both in the land of Israel and in the diaspora.
