MEN'S CLUB NOTES

BREAKFAST MEETING SUNDAY, JUNE 6

Members and prospective members of the Men's Club are invited to the monthly Breakfast Meeting on Sunday morning, June 6th. at 10:00 o'clock. It is being tendered in memory of our past President, Frederick E. Goldstein, by the Goldstein Family.

SHAVUOS NOTES

On Thursday night, May 27th, the fiftieth day following the second day of Passover, we usher in the Festival of Shavuos, the Feast of Weeks. This holiday is of great significance in the Jewish calendar, for on this day we received the Torah on Mount Sinai. It is therefore known as "Zman Matan Toraseinu," the season of the giving of the Torah.

To commemorate this divine event we decorate our Synagogue with leaves and flowers reminiscent of the greenery atop Mt. Sinai. Our Women's League will again provide the floral decorations.

A hallowed tradition is the "Mishmar," the all night vigil and reciting "Tikun Shavuos," selections from the Bible and Mishnah and other sacred writings.

It is a custom to eat dairy foods on this festival. One reason given is that the Torah has been likened to "milk and honey."

This festival has two additional names in the Torah:

"Chag Ha'asif" (The Festival of Reaping)—Exodus XXIII—refers to the reaping of wheat which is the last grain of the season to be harvested. Festivities are held over the new gift offering which is brought to the House of G-d.

"Yom Habikurim" (The Day of the First Fruit—Numbers XXVIII—marks the "new gift offering" of two show-breads which renders permissible the bringing of gift offerings to the Sanctuary from the grain of the new season. This day initiates the period of the offering on the altar of first fruits from the seven species for which the Land of Israel is praised.

"Atzeres" is another designation not cited in the Torah but used by the Sages to connote the character of the festival as being a concluding "eighth day" to the "seven days" of Passover, similar to Shemini Atzeres which follows Succos and is called the "Atzeres of Pesach."

During the morning services of the first day we read from the Torah the Ten Commandments and chant the "Akdamos," a beautiful poem in Aramaic, in adoration of the Almighty and the Torah. On the second day, the idyllic story of Ruth is read. This is to commemorate the *Yahrzeit* of King David who was descended from Ruth.

NEW NEIGHBORS WELCOME

We are delighted to learn of newcomers in our community. Our readers are asked to advise Rabbi Reichel of their names, addresses and phone number so that they may receive a personal welcome.

It is not permissible to cook or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next year or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival enables us to cook on Friday Yom Tov for the Sabbath. Inasmuch as this year Shavuos will be on Friday and Saturday, the ceremony of "Eruv Tavshilin" should be performed on Thursday.

Challah or matzah and some cooked food such as an egg are placed on a plate. The head of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ata a-do---elo-kenu melech ha-olam asher kid-sha-nu bemitzvosav vet-zivanu al mitzvas eruv... By virtue of this eruv be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath." On Saturday afternoon the food is to be eaten.

SAVING POSTAGE
