## MEN'S CLUB ANNUAL YOUTH CONCERT AWARD AT W.S.I.S. CONCERT HALL SUNDAY, JUNE 19 — 3:00 P.M.

The W.S.I.S. Concert Hall vibrated last year with shouts of bravo and will do so again at the Men's Club Annual Youth Concert Award on Sunday afternoon, June 19th, at 3:00. This year's award recipients, Marianne Burke, Soprano, and Abram Morales, Tenor, will give a concert of favorite Opera arias and duets with Richard Gordon at the piano. An added attraction will be a group of Yiddish and Spanish songs.

Marianne Burke's voice was described by the *Village Time* as: "Rich, large, and mellow — usually associated with a mezzo range. Surprisingly, it also races every portion of the soprano coloratura range... She has unlimited charm and stage presence... Why isn't she at the Met right now?"

Abram Morales has in a few years amassed an impressive list of credits including engagements with the New York City Opera, the San Francisco Opera and with other companies countrywide from Boston to Honolulu. In a recent performance of *Manon* in New York, Donald Henahan, music critic of *The N. Y. Times*, wrote, "Mr. Morales put one in mind of the young Giuseppe di Stefano." Music critic Bill Zakariasen of the *N. Y. Daily News* wrote, "Handsome tenor Abram Morales is the finest des Grieux New York has known since Nicolai Gedda — Morales' voice is exceptionally beautiful, his singing flawlessly controlled, his characterization touchingly believable — he deserves star billing at the Met." Mr. Morales is under Columbia Artist Management.

These concerts not only promote the artistry of young musicians but also are a means of raising funds for our Synagogue. **DINNER HONORING RABBI AND REBBITZIN REICHEL SETS RECORDS****Emil Glucker's 80th Birthday Celebrated**

Records were set at The Congregational Dinner held at the Essex House on Sunday, March 6th in honor of our Rabbi's 36 years (twice chai) of service to the Synagogue together with our Rebbitzin, and their 36th wedding anniversary, and in celebration of Mr. Emil Glucker's 80th birthday. More people attended this dinner, more funds were raised than ever before, the Souvenir Journal had to be bound like a book, the largest single donation ever made in the history of the Synagogue was announced, and the program featured two of the most widely known and respected Jewish leaders in the country.

From the moment the band struck up *Or Zarua Latzadik* to welcome our Rabbi and Rebbitzin into the elegant ballroom, every aspect of the dinner was filled with excitement. After the singing of the anthems led by our Cantor Peter L. Barron, the delightful tone for the dinner was maintained consistently by the dramatic, articulate and charming M.C. for the evening, Mrs. Maurice Goodgold, our own Sally, known to many as the Chair of our Synagogue's Suchah Committee and as our resident community political activist.

**BOOK OF RUTH — YIZKOR**

After President William Foont's greeting and Rabbi Hillel Reichel's recitation of the Hamotzee, the orchestra led in the revival of the WSIS theme song that had won a contest in 1937, to the tune of "Clementine." Dinner Co-Chairman Harry J. Denberg spoke exuberantly about how, after running 10 successful dinners for the Synagogue, he felt that this year's dinner was "like hitting the lottery number." He pointed out that in another four years we'll be celebrating 50 years in this Synagogue and made it clear that he wants to see one and all at the 50th anniversary. Mr. Denberg then introduced the venerable Rabbi Pinchos Teitz, later referred to by Rabbi Reichel as "the Rabbi's Rabbi." Rabbi Teitz is Chief Rabbi of Elizabeth and has been airing a world renowned weekly radio program on the Talmud for over 30 years. Rabbi Teitz expressed the dominant theme of the evening: "We are gathered to express our recognition, admiration and appreciation to Rabbi and Mrs. Reichel for giving spiritual leadership to one of the finest Synagogues in New York." Rabbi Teitz then declared, "if we would have, in Jewish life, an authority to declare an institution as an historic place, I would suggest that the WSIS should be declared as such."

Rabbi Aaron I. Reichel was then asked to read an important letter that had been hand-delivered to his father five days before the Dinner. The letter from Paul B. Gibney, Jr., Esq., President of the Simon and Annie Davis Foundation, established by the longtime WSIS Director Abraham M. Davis, electrified everyone in the ballroom with its formal commitment that the Foundation was donating \$36,000 to the Synagogue in commemoration of Rabbi Reichel's "36 years of devoted service to WSIS" and further pledging to give \$25,000 each year, for an additional six years "for those purposes and on those projects which you [Rabbi Reichel] deem worthy, and of which you approve."

In introducing Rabbi Reichel, Mrs. Goodgold said: "The Synagogue is his life. As a young man, he came here, and shared the *bima* with Rabbi Herbert Goldstein, of blessed memory. He watched it flourish. He saw it burn down. He helped to rebuild it. And tonight he has helped to insure its future. He has led...the quintessential life with his teachings and his writings, his commitment to Israel, to Jewish organizations and in the building of a very beautiful family. We are indeed all part of his family, if family means you have someone to call upon at any hour of the day or night for any problem when you are at any age. It has helped to have at his side a Rebbitzin like

Josephine Goldstein Reichel, who has brought luster to this Synagogue and to Judaism in and of her own right as 21-year President of the Agudah Women of America and as the soul of the Women's League which bears her mother's name."

Rabbi Reichel began his talk by pointing out that the ideal manner of repaying our mentors and benefactors is by conveying their teachings and acts of faith to others. He noted that the Davis Foundation has given a new dimension to our Synagogue's financial structure in making possible the further expansion of our programs. He concluded by calling upon his beloved Rebbitzin to share the spotlight with him as she has shared in all his accomplishments over the years. Rebbitzin Josephine ascended to the lectern and offered the prayer that she and the Rabbi will be privileged to continue to enjoy the friendship of all those present for a long, long time.

The formal presentation of the most talked about check of the evening was made in the presence of the officers of the Synagogue, the Co-Chairmen of the Dinner, and the Dinner Treasurer and Secretary, Gerard and Gerda Benjamin, who had been called to the dais.

The lively *horah* dancing that followed was interrupted only with the entrance into the ballroom of a unique dignitary, Mr. Julius Berman, President of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America as well as the Chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations. After reviewing his latest personal conversations with President Reagan in the Oval Office of the White House, and with Prime Minister Begin in Israel, he said that his main purpose in coming to this dinner was "in a personal feeling of recognition and tribute to a man who...is considered a leader by his peers."

Mr. Benjamin, on behalf of the Committee, presented the Rabbi and Rebbitzin with an impressive gift.

Mr. Samuel Gursky, Co-Chairman of the Dinner, then introduced our distinguished member and noted philanthropist, Mr. Emil Glucker, who the Synagogue was honoring upon his 80th birthday, and presented him with an elegant *tallis* with a silver *attarah*.

Our indefatigable Mrs. Samuel Gursky,

Mr. and Mrs. League President and Bazaar Co-Chairman, read a telegram from our Trustee and Mrs. Herman H. Cohen who were compelled to miss this annual event for the first time because of health reasons.

On a lighter note, an anonymous poem in tribute to the Rabbi and Rebbitzin was read by Mrs. Miriam Reichel Bronner, their daughter, who had come from Israel to join in the festivities, and by Mrs. Jeannette Jacobs, Honorary President of the Women's League and member of the Board of Trustees.

Later in the evening, the 93-year-old Mr. Max Selsky, a former Men's Club Vice-President, who recently began a second career as an artist, presented the Rabbi with one of his vibrant paintings.

To round out the evening, Cantor Barron held everyone spellbound with his captivating singing. He began with Yiddish and Hebrew songs and then he introduced his repertoire in the vernacular with a thrilling rendition of "The Impossible Dream," echoing the thoughts of the Rabbi and Rebbitzin that this evening represented a Rabbi's dream come true.

We hope this extraordinary affair will inspire all our congregants to continued enthusiastic participation in our manifold activities throughout the year.
