L'AG B'OMER SUNDAY, MAY 20

The 33rd day of the counting of the Omer is known as L'ag (lamed = 30; gimel = 3).

On L'ag B'Omer Bar Kochba defeated the Romans in his unsuccessful revolt (132-35 C.E.). During that same period a plague broke out which raged among the disciples of Rabbi Akiba and ceased on L'ag B'Omer.

Though it is in the *Sefirah* period, weddings and haircuts are permitted on L'ag B'Omer. It is permissible to take a haircut on the preceding Friday in honor of the Sabbath.

SHAVUOS NOTES

On Tuesday evening, June 5th, the fiftieth day following the second day of Passover, we usher in the Festival of Shavuos, the Feast of Weeks. This holiday is of great significance in the Jewish calendar, for on this day we received the Torah on Mount Sinai. It is therefore known as *Zman Matan Toraseinu*, the season of the giving of the Torah.

To commemorate this divine event we decorate our Synagogue with leaves and flowers reminiscent of the greenery atop Mt. Sinai. Our Women's League will again provide the floral decorations.

A hallowed tradition is the *Mishmar*, the all-night vigil and reciting *Tikun Shavuos*, selections from the Bible and Mishnah and other sacred writings.

It is a custom to eat dairy foods on this festival. One reason given is that the Torah has been likened to "milk and honey."

This festival has two additional names in the Torah:

Chag Ha'asif (The Festival of Reaping)—Exodus XXIII—refers to the reaping of wheat which is the last grain of the season to be harvested.

Yom Habikurim (The Day of the First Fruit)—Numbers XXVIII—marks the "new gift offering" of two show-breads which renders permissible the bringing of gift offerings to the Sanctuary from the grain of the new season. This day initiates the period of the offering of first fruits for which the Land of Israel is praised.

"Atzeres" is another designation not cited in the Torah but used by the Sages to connote the character of the festival as being a concluding "eighth day" to the "seven days" of Passover, similar to Shemini Atzeres which follows Succos—and is called the "Atzeres of Pesach."

During the morning services of the first day we read from the Torah the Ten Commandments and chant the "Akdamos," a beautiful poem in Aramaic, in adoration of the Almighty and the Torah. On the second day, the idyllic story of Ruth is read. This is to commemorate the *Yahrzeit* of King David who was descended from Ruth.
