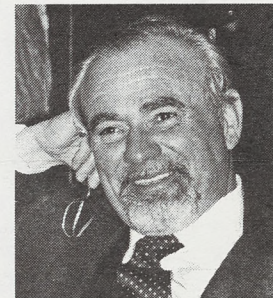
OUR HONORED CHASSANIM FOR SIMCHAS TORAH

One of our newest Synagogue members, Dr. Seymour Weissman, the Chassan Torah, will be called to the closing *aliyah* of the Torah. Born in Wurzburg, Germany, he came to the United States at an early age. He is presently Director of Auxiliary Services for the High Schools of the New York City Board of Education and was the recipient of the James E. Allen Memorial Award for Distinguished Service to Education by the New York State Board of Regents. He was commissioned Colonel in the United States Army where he evaluated its schools. He served as U.J.A. Chairman for Brooklyn and was a Trustee of the East Midwood Jewish Center. His wife, Beatrice Betty, is Hearing Officer in the Office of Appeals and Review in the N.Y.C. Board of Education. They are proud of their two daughters, Jennifer Sari and Barbara Ann, who is married to Steven Dershowitz.

Our newly elected Trustee, Benjamin Suckewer, is our Chassan Breishis and will be called to the Torah for the first *aliyah* in *Genesis*. He was born in Ulm, Germany, to parents who were survivors of the Holocaust. After attending elementary and High School Yeshivos, he graduated Columbia College and its Law School where he was a Harlan Fiske Stone scholar, with time out for a year at Hebrew University. His wife, Margo Weaker, of New Orleans, is associated with Shearson-Lehman/American Express limited partnership services.

Our newly appointed Advisory Board member, Dr. Emanuel Seidman, will be the Chassan Maftir and will chant the *haftorah* from the Book of Joshua. Born in New York City, he studied at Yeshiva University where he earned his Ph.D. He is a psychoanalyst practicing on the West Side. His professional honors include the presidency of the Board of Trustees of the American Institute of Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis as well as the presidency of the Board of Directors of the Community Guidance Service. SUCCOS NOTES

On Wednesday eve, October 10th, we usher in the Festival of Tabernacles. Following the solemn High Holidays, it is in contrast a time of thanksgiving and joy.

Breakfast in the Succah will be available following each of the weekday morning services.

The Succah consists of at least three walls and covering (*sechach*). All materials are proper for the walls of the Succah. The *sechach* is limited to that which grows but is detached from the soil, such as severed tree branches, strips of wood and bamboo. The materials must never have acquired the status of utensils.

The Four Species

The essence of the mitzvah is to hold the four species in the hand. The preferred manner of performing the mitzvah is to wave the lulav in all six directions: four horizontal and upwards and downwards; each waving consisting of three movements to and fro.

The meaning of these *na'anu'im* (wavings) is given in the Talmud: "One waves them to and fro to Him who owns the four directions; up and down, to Him who owns heaven and earth. That is to say: the four species are all an allusion to G-d's having created all existence, and that there is naught besides Him. One waves them to and fro in order to restrain harmful winds; up and down, in order to restrain harmful dew." Succos is the time of judgment for water and rain for the entire year and the four species give symbolic expression to our prayers for the blessing of water (the esrog needs more water than other fruits of the tree; palm branches grow in valleys which have an abundance of water; myrtles and willows grow near water).

The Sages have decreed that the *mitzvah* of the four species should not be performed on the Sabbath, even if the first day of the festival falls on the Sabbath, lest one come thereby to violate the prohibition of carrying in a public domain on the Sabbath.

Hoshana

After Hallel is said during the days of Succos or after *musaf*, depending on local custom, a Torah scroll is taken out of the Ark and brought to the *bimah* (pulpit). The cantor and the congregation say aloud: "*Hoshana*" four times as indicated in the prayer books. Afterwards a prescribed prayer is said each day; each of these prayers follows the alphabetical order. Simultaneously the entire congregation circles the *bimah* with esrog and lulav in hand.

During the first six festival days, there is one *hakafah* (circling) while on Hoshana Rabbah (the last day of Succos) there are seven *hakafos*. This custom recalls the

Sanctuary where the Cohanim encircled the altar with praise and joy once each day and seven times on Hoshana Rabbah.

Hoshana Rabbah is the last day for the observance of the Four Species and Succah. It is called Hoshana Rabbah (*rabbah* = numerous), since more *hoshanos* are said on this day than on all the previous days of the festival.

It is customary to stay awake all night and to say *Tikun* from the book of *Dvarim* and *Tehilim*.

The Aravah on Hoshana Rabbah

It was a custom of the Prophets Chagai, Zechariah and Malachi to take an *aravah* (willow) and beat it on the ground.

The *aravas* which are taken after the esrog and lulav are set aside also alludes to prayer. We possess neither the taste of Torah, nor the fragrance of mitzvah, neither the esrog nor the lulav, nor the hadas — we are all like this *aravah*. What then do we have? Only mouths with which to pray like this *aravah* similar to a mouth.

It is customary to stay awake all night and to say *Tikun* from the book of *Dvarim*, the *Tehilim*, and to "unite" the night and the day through Torah and prayer.

The Prayer for Rain

"During the Succos Festival there is judgment over water."

Beginning with *Musaf* of *Shmeenee Atzeres*, we include *MASHIV HARUACH UMORID HAGESHEM* in the *Shmoneh Esrei*. An announcement is made before the silent *Musaf* to include the *MASHIV HARUACH* which is recited until Passover.

It would have been proper to mention rain (*Mashiv haruach umorid hagashem*) on the first day of the Festival. Nevertheless, we do not explicitly pray for rain before *Shmeenee Atzeres*.

The Sages explain that the fall of rain during the Festival would prevent the fulfillment of the mitzvah of Succah. For this reason rain is not mentioned until the people of Israel have left their Succos and reentered their homes.

Simchas Torah

Why do we begin with *Breishis* on *Simchas Torah*? The Sages have said (*Sifree Va'eschanan*): In order to show that the Torah is beloved to us like a new object and not like an old command which a person does not submit to — it is like a new one towards which everyone runs.
