SHAVUOS NOTES

On Saturday evening, May 25th, the fiftieth day following the second day of Passover, we usher in the Festival of Shavuos, the Feast of Weeks. This holiday is of great significance in the Jewish calendar, for on this day we received the Torah on Mount Sinai. It is therefore known as *Zman Matan Toraseinu*, the season of the giving of the Torah.

To commemorate this divine event we decorate our Synagogue with leaves and flowers reminiscent of the greenery atop Mt. Sinai. Our Women's League will again provide the floral decorations.

A hallowed tradition is the *Mishmar*, the all-night vigil and reciting *Tikun Shavuos*, selections from the Bible and Mishnah and other sacred writings.

The first day we read the Ten Commandments and chant the "Akdamos" in adoration of the Almighty and the Torah. On the second day the Book of Ruth is read to commemorate the *Yahrzeit* of King David who was descended from Ruth.

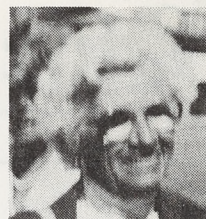
NEW YEAR GREETINGS
