On the second night, a fruit which we have not yet eaten in its season is placed on the table at the time of Kiddush. The Shehecheyanu recited in the Kiddush applies also to this fruit. After the Hamotzee and partaking of the challah, a prayer over the fruit is recited.

The Shofar

One of the awe-inspiring portions of the New Year service is the sounding of the ram's horn calling to penitence. Mr. Nash Aussenberg will again blow the shofar.

The prescribed order of the Shofar sounds begins with a *Tekiah* — a call for awakening and hope; followed by the broken tones of *Shevarim* and *Teruah*, which are likened to stifled sobs, remorse for the past failings; and conclude with the *Tekiah* call for renewed active life in G-d's spirit.

Tashlich

The deeply symbolic ritual takes place on the first day of Rosh Hashanah when we go to a body of water and resolve to free ourselves of our sins, as in *Micha*, "And you shall cast all your sins into the depths of the sea."

Our youngsters will assemble in front of the Synagogue at 5:40 p.m., and will proceed together to Central Park for the observance of Tashlich. Delicious sweets will be distributed with the compliments of the House of Gross.

Shabbas Shuvah

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashanah is known as the Sabbath of Repentance because of the Haftorah chanted on this Sabbath from the Book of Hosea which begins with the words, SHUVAH YISRAEL, "Return (repent) O Israel to thy G-d."

As is customary every year, Rabbi Reichel will deliver the Shabbas Shuvah Halachic Discourse after Minchah.

Erev Yom Kippur — Tues., Sept. 24

The Erev Yom Kippur Minchah service precedes the final meal of that day. The *Al Chate* prayer of Yom Kippur is added to the *Shmoneh Esray* (see Yom Kippur Machzor). Minchah services will be at 2:00 and 2:15 P.M.

Reminder: Bring non-leather footwear for Yom Kippur beginning with Kol Nidrei.

Yom Kippur

The solemn Season of Repentance reaches its highest climax on Yom Kippur. On this day we must be sincere in our desire to repent and observe the Biblical command of depriving ourselves of food, drink, washing and anointing of our bodies, wearing of leather shoes and other earthly pleasures.

Succos

On Sunday eve, September 29th, we usher in the Festival of Tabernacles. Following the solemn High Holidays, it is in contrast a time of thanksgiving and joy.

Breakfast in the Succah will be available following each of the weekday morning services.

The Succah consists of at least three walls and covering (*sechach*). All materials are proper for the walls of the Succah. The *sechach* is limited to that which grows but is detached from the soil,

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such as severed tree branches, strips of wood and bamboo. The materials must not have acquired the status of utensils.

The Four Species

The essence of the mitzvah is to hold the four species in the hand. The preferred manner of performing the mitzvah is to wave the lulav in all six directions: four horizontal and upwards and downwards; each waving consisting of three movements to and fro.

The meaning of these *na'anu'im* (wavings) is given in the Talmud: "One waves them to and fro to Him who owns the four directions; up and down, to Him who owns heaven and earth. That is to say: the four species are all an allusion to G-d's having created all existence, and that there is naught besides Him. One waves them to and fro in order to restrain harmful winds; up and down, in order to restrain harmful dews." Succos is the time of judgment for water and rain for the entire year and the four species give symbolic expression to our prayers for the blessing of water (the esrog needs more water than other fruits of the tree; palm branches grow in valleys which have an abundance of water; myrtles and willows grow near water).

The Sages have decreed that the *mitzvah* of the four species should not be performed on the Sabbath, even if the first day of the festival falls on the Sabbath, lest one come thereby to violate the prohibition of carrying in a public domain on the Sabbath.

Hoshana

After Hallel is said during the days of Succos or after *musaf*, depending on local custom, a Torah scroll is taken out of the Ark and brought to the *bimah* (pulpit). The cantor and the congregation say aloud: "*Hoshana*" four times as indicated in the prayer books. Afterwards a prescribed prayer is said each day; each of these prayers follows the alphabetical order. Simultaneously the entire congregation circles the *bimah* with esrog and lulav in hand. During the first six festival days, there is one *hakafah* (circling) while on Hoshana Rabbah (the last day of Succos) there are seven *hakafos*.

This custom recalls the Sanctuary where the Cohanim encircled the altar with praise and joy once each day and seven times on Hoshana Rabbah.

The Aravah on Hoshana Rabbah

It was a custom of the Prophets Chagai, Zechariah and Malachi to take an *aravah*, to recite a special prayer over it, and then beat it on the ground. Unlike other Rabbinic commandments over which a blessing is recited, no blessing is recited over the *aravah*.

The *aravas* (extra willows) which are taken on that day after the esrog and lulav are set aside also alludes to prayer. We possess neither the taste of Torah, nor the fragrance of mitzvah, neither the esrog nor the lulav, nor the hadas—we are all like this *aravah*. What then do we have? Only mouths with which to pray like this *aravah* similar to a mouth.

It is customary to stay awake all night and to say *Tikun* from the book of *Dvarim*, the *Tehilim*, and to "unite" the night and the day through Torah and prayer.
