LAWS AND CUSTOMS OF THE SYNAGOGUE

Following the reading of the Torah, the one who is called to raise the Scroll should open it so that three columns of the script are visible. When raising it, he should turn about in all directions so that the text can be seen by the entire congregation, at which time the verse "And this is the law which Moses set before the Children of Israel according to the commandment of G-d by the hand of Moses" is recited.

As the Torah is returned to the Holy Ark, the MAGBEEAH (the one who raised the Torah) and the GOLEL (the one who rolled it together) accompany the procession from the Bimah to the Holy Ark.
